Part A: What is the plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and what is the outcome by the end of the year)

Plan of action - 2007-08

Quality Enhancement:

1. Continuation of Autonomy activities .
 - a. Pattern of Question paper and introducing few chapters to the common core syllabus.
 - b. Strengthening the Jawahar Knowledge Centre that enhances the job opportunities.
 - c. To suit the communication requirement of the students, the Department of English has conducted one extension lecture on “Importance of Communication Skills: English for Today and Tomorrow” was organized in an effort to enhance the competitive abilities of the students in facing interviews and securing placements. In view of the urgency to prepare students for the newly introduced computer based testing, an extension lecture in the subject with demonstration was organized. Project work programme made compulsory to imbibe the spirit of research attitude among the students
 - d. Wide variety of programmes curricular and Co-curricular are arranged. Field trips, educational tours and visits to historical sites are conducted to enhance the quality of learning . A two-day workshop on “Repositioning of Higher Education for improving quality in teaching of Commerce” is organized by the department with the guidance of CCE, Hyderabad in which more than seventy lecturers from various college of Andhra Pradesh participated. Prominent personalities and professors in various universities gave presentations on the topic during the two-day seminar. Fifteen students are selected for ICICI Bank Certificate Course in “Foundations for Banking Career” training and placement programme organized by ICICI Bank with expert assistance from CCE, Hyderabad. The department also arranged a seminar on Tally by inviting professionals from Tally Academy. The Department of Microbiology organized an extension lecture on 21-09-2007 by inviting Dr S. Janaki Rani, Principal, Govt. Degree College for Women, Begumpet. She delivered a lecture on Bio fertilizers. The Department organized industrial visit to Jeedimetla, a fluent treatment limited on 22-11-2007 where in more than forty students participated. .

2. Student centric Activities:

- Field trips, educational tours and visits to historical sites are conducted to enhance the quality of learning. The Department also organized an industrial visit on 24-11-2007 to Pratishta Biotech Limited where in thirty five students participated. The Department organized a field-work programme to 'Khadi Gramodyog Mahavidyalaya' during the year. The Department, as an extension activity conducted Snake Live Show in collaboration with A.P. Forest Department where in more than fifty snakes (venomous and non-venomous) were shown and their behaviour are explained. The Department of Tourism & Travel Management organized an extension lecture by inviting Dr A.K.V.S. Reddy, Director, Salarjung Museum on 21-01-2008. He gave an extension lecture on "Importance of Museums & Tourisms".
- Training programmes on Soft Skills by the corporate trainers arranged.
- Student friendly programmes to improve their spoken skills and written skills are arranged.
- Compulsory computer awareness certificate courses for all to enable them become competent in using internet facility.
- Creating opportunities within the college on a regular basis to prepare the bright ones for doing project works and disadvantaged ones remedial classes.
- Celebrate important days like birthdays of eminent personalities, death anniversaries, National Days/Human Rights Day/Teachers' Day/ etc., in order to challenge the students with thoughts of integrity and unity.
- The college has two NSS Units. The NSS Unit-I have organized an NSS Camp at Kuntloor village between 17-01-2008 and 26-01-2008 under the supervision of Mr Girija Shanker Rao. The NSS Unit-II also organized an NSS Camp for science student at Kuntollor village from 17-01-2008 to 26-01-2008 under the supervision of Dr J. Narender Reddy, with financial assistance from Osmania University, Hyderabad.
- Our College NCC Unit is one of the vibrant units in the State. Our cadets excelled in various activities during the year 2007-08. Two cadets participated in Rock Climbing activity in Kerala during June,2007. Two of our cadets attended National Integration Camps held at Vishakapatnam and Tirupathi and Gaziabad. Several cadets attended Training Camps held in Karnataka, and local Republic Day Camp.
- The academic year 2007-08 sent out its second Batch of students sunder the Semester pattern and the autonomous system fortified their learning and provided numerous opportunities. During the year

2007-08 about 74 students have been given training through the JKC. Apart from this in the month of November, 07 about 56 students took training under the “Infosys Project Genesis Training Programme”. This programme was introduced for the first time in Andhra Pradesh by the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, A.P. Hyderabad. This project was first introduced in Karnataka then in Gujarat, Orissa and Maharashtra. The aim of this project is to prepare Fresh outgoing batch of students for a Placement Drive by the Infosys. For the first time, about 20 students got placed in Infosys from our JKC. To cater to the neighboring colleges, during September-December one batch with 30 students was exclusively run for III year students from BJR Government College, Hyderabad. About 6 students were short listed while one candidate got selected for ICICI Telecom Services.
