### Plan of action - 2008-09

#### Quality Enhancement:

1. Continuation of Autonomy activities.

  - g. Fourteen extension Lectures and two workshops are held to strengthen the academic programme.
2. **Student centric Activities:**
  - To suit the communication requirement of the students, the Department of English has conducted extension lectures on "New English and Emerging Trends in English Language Teaching, The Art of Speaking English and Winning over the world through word power" was organized in an effort to enhance the competitive abilities of the students in facing interviews and securing placements.
  - The Department of Telugu has celebrated '*Telugu Bhashaa Dinoshavam*' on 29-08-2007. The department arranged a programme on '*Aadhunika Kaalaanugunangaa Telugu Bhashaa – Aadhyanam, Bhoothana*' on the day. The department also organized '*Bhaashaa – Pracheenatha*' during November 2008. The members of the Department attended National Seminar organized by the Department of Telugu, Govt. Degree College for Women, Begumpet and also presented papers during the Seminar. Smt B. Madhubala, in-charge Department of Telugu chaired a session during the Seminar. The members of the

Department have continuously attending several meetings conducted by Telugu University '*Telugu Bhaashaa Praceena Prathipathi*'

- The Department of Commerce has conducted six guest lectures by inviting eminent personalities in the field. Fifteen students are selected for ICICI Bank Certificate Course in "Foundations for Banking Career" training and placement programme organized by ICICI Bank with expert assistance from CCE, Hyderabad. The department also arranged a seminar on Tally by inviting professionals from Tally Academy. The Department actively conducting Tally programme with the assistance of CCE and JKC. Two batches of fifty students were completed.
- During the year 2008-09 about 274 students have been given training through the JKC. Apart from this for the first time in the history of Collegiate Education, Andhra Pradesh Accounting Executive Course training has been started to train the students of Arts and Commerce in employable skills. Tally software has been made available to the students. The Jawahar Knowledge Centre has provided an excellent platform for this course. Our students are greatly benefited through this. Mr. Daniel Silvanus, the JKC Coordinator and the Accounting Executive Course Organizer Mr. B. Girija Shankar Rao have been taking care of the Tally Training Programme on the campus. First batch of 50 students got recently concluded successfully.
- Training programmes on Soft Skills by the corporate trainers arranged. Student friendly programmes to improve their spoken skills and written skills are arranged.
- Compulsory computer awareness certificate courses for all to enable them become competent in using internet facility.
- Creating opportunities within the college on a regular basis to prepare the bright ones for doing project works and disadvantaged ones remedial classes.

Dr Amar Jyothi Jaiswal, In-charge Department of Hindi guided Ph.D students as Research Supervisor. She has presented a paper in the National Seminar organized by Milind Publishers and chaired National Seminar organized by Adhoni College of Arts & Commerce on 13-09-2008. She has been the Resource Person in various other seminars organized by various colleges under UGC guidelines. ### 33. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling unit:
